Anticipating a smaller turn-out, the luncheon venue was moved to Alto 88 on the 31st floor, in fact in the end we had a good collection of members and guests and extra room had to be made. P William kicked off the meeting at 1pm, and welcomes our guests who were visiting Rotarian Barry Chan from RC of HK Harbour, our own ex-PP and former member Leslie Soltay and visiting guest Jennie, spouse of PP Laurence.

After the announcements, the Red Box contribution was recorded as \$1,300, before P William asked PE Chris to introduce our guests speaker Mr Charles Brian-Boys, here to tell us how he wrapped the IFC with a newspaper. PP Stephen was invited to thank the speaker before we rose to give a toast to RI, RC HK Harbour and HKIE and assemble for a group photo.









SPOTLIGHT ON - How the IFC was wrapped



In 2003, Charles Brian-Boys was head of a prominent local media company. He talked about it being a difficult time in the city, with challenges such as SARS, and how the government was trying to keep the city 'lifted' wuth events such as Harbour Fest.

One day he was driving in to work along the Eastern Corridor, looking across at one of the greatest skylines in the world, and at the new IFC which was being finished and he thought 'Hang on – there's a big media idea there waiting to be explored'. His idea was to clad the yet to be finished building with an giant ad. A big bold idea which would take a lot of selling to make it happen. There were challenges: getting an agreement from MTR and developer Sun Hung Kai properties. Finding a commercial sponsor, and getting permission from the government. On top of that, there was catastrophe insurance to be granted, and total costs overall, which came to HK\$4 million. A number of clients were approached with the opportunity, incuding Nomura, Tiffany & Co, Hennessy and Financial Times, all future tenants of the building. Eventually, it was the FT which took up the opportunity, resulting in what became the largest single ever advertising billboard in the world, seen from miles around. The IFC was literally wrapped around with the FT. Given the media coverage and worldwide recognition and interest in the project,



the ROI on the investment (for FT) was huge, and the project went down in history as a world records (entered in the Guinness Book of Records).

Previously a partner at The Ball Partnership, CEO of Batey China, and regional Marketing & Sales Director Alfred Dunhill. Highlights from Charles' career include the origination of the TAG Heuer brand and

Intel Inside brand. With experience in brand strategy for multinational brands, he was named in A d A g e's t o p 100 influential marketers in 2002.


TRACK PROGRESS TOWARD THE 2015-16 PRESIDENTIAL CITATION
