SPOTLIGHT ON - Understanding how investors make decisions

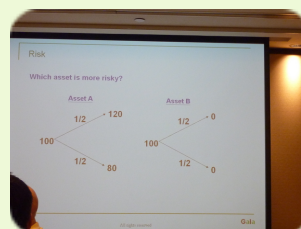


Mr Kong began by telling us about his background – he started out in engineering prior to embarking on a career in investing (engineering investment deals instead!), and then introduced us to his topic, which was a fascinating insight into the psychology of investing. How we respond as human beings in certain investment situations, and how it affects our choices in terms of the psychological factors and misconceptions in measurements of return, and how they impact rational decision making. A number of established finance theories are based on the assumption that investors are rational decision makers. A growing body of research has however exposed flaws in this long-held assumption and highlights the human factors in investment decision making.

His talk also explored how psychological factors and misconceptions in measurements of risk and return weigh on investment decisions, and shared examples in the application of the "Prospect Theory", a Nobel prize winning framework that models public behavior in the face of risk.

About the speaker

Kong Kwok Wai is a Director at Barclays Capital and heads the transaction review function for structured products. He has over 10 years of experience in the banking industry and frequently conducts Finance trainings throughout the Asia Pacific region. Mr. Kong received an MBA with a focus in Finance from New York University in 1999. He also holds a CFA charter and a Master's degree in Engineering.
