I was astounded by this lack of awareness of the outside world among our young people, and it occurred to me the importance, and responsibility we have to help open their minds to what goes on outside Hong Kong and outside of the limits of video games like Pokemon. As Rotarians, we pride ourselves on being good global citizens, especially where international service is concerned. I think in future we should give this some thought when we are doing any Rotaract training. Thankyou again to PP Jonathan and all involved for a valuable day's work!

# Spotlight On - Hong Kong artist Stanley Wong



Stanley Wong started his talk by giving us some background on his creative past. He worked in advertising and design, and was a successful, award-winning creative director, creating campaigns for companies like MTR and Hong Kong Telecom. He then explained that, one day, he had a sort of awakening. Questioning his own existence and what he was getting out of his work. He wanted to do more, he wanted to contribute. To Hong Kong, and to the world. He was looking for meaning, and was drawn in another direction when one day he was invited to contribute some work to an exhibition. This led to the creation of he 'Red, white and blue' photography and design series. What started as an observation about the ubiquitous red, white and blue plastic sheeting that we see

everywhere as bags and covering, became a full blown art movement, with photography, a book, sculptures and a product range which

was created to help a charity. This helped inspire Stanley to know the direction he should go in as 'Anothermountainman' his artist persona. And he proceeded to tell us about how has been able to juggle his commercial work (he still directs TV commercials) with his artistic projects. Today he is well known in Hong Kong and the international design world. Stanley finished by telling us about his philosophy, and how he wants to use his work to spread messages to the world. He is Hong Kong born and bred and loves his city. He wants to do good for Hong Kong, and this is reflected in his work.



### About the speaker

Stanley Wong is a renowned Hong Kong born a visual communicator - artist, designer, photographer, film director. He trained as a designer, winning many awards in the design and advertising fields in his earlier career. He came to international attention with his "redwhiteblue" series, which he presented at the 51st Venice Biennale in 2005 representing Hong Kong. He was awarded at the Hong Kong Contemporary Art Awards 2012 and the Hong Kong Arts Development Awards 2011 – award for best artist (visual arts) in 2012. His "lanwei" series was collected by M+ museum, Hong Kong in 2013. At the recent Hong Kong Design Association global design awards 2016, his company received 17 awards, including Gold and Judge's Choice.
