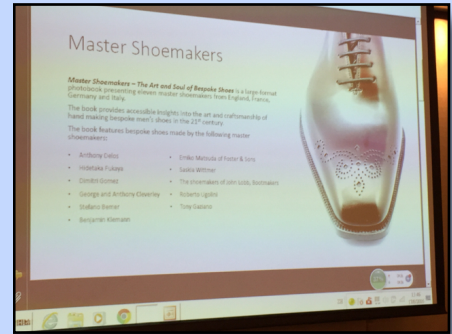

Spotlight On - Master Shoemaking



Gary Tok gave one of our most interesting talks, and started by introducing himself and his background, before explaining all about his passion for bespoke tailoring and shoemaking, and in particular, the style of Italy. He first gave us a bit of an overview regarding the basics of well tailored suits, and an interesting point being that modern suits are based on a cut which originated from military uniforms, where the cut was designed to enhance the masculine appeal of the wearer. But today the focus was on the feet, and what we wear on them. Gary is particularly passionate about bespoke shoes, and as such is about to publish a book entitled 'Master Shoemaking'. He has travelled extensively to Italy, where he visits his own tailor. Gary talked about the difference in styles of tailoring from

different countries, and in particular, pointed out the fact that men in particular, spend very little time considering footwear when dressing for the day, observing that women notice this. There was a lot of laughter and debate about this. Finally Gary gave us a brief look at the content of his book, and noted that he could spend just as long talking about the right socks to wear!
