Spotlight On - Think On Your Feet



Kate Chan began by sharing a video with us, of the late Steve Jobs in action, presenting the i-Phone for the first time. It was a demonstration of what 'Think On Your Feet' is all about. Think On Your Feet is based on an idea by its founder Roger HB Davies, a writer, editor and communication guru who had the vision to take a simple concept and build it into an international enterprise.

Think On Your feet is a structured and informative process which works logically and succinctly on these pillars: Be

INFORMATIVE - Package information logically and succinctly. Be **ASSERTIVE** - Position arguments to persuade your audience. Be **VISUAL** - Appeal to your audience with images and analogies.

The secret of thinking on your feet is to be prepared: learn some skills and tactics, and do some preparation for situations that might put you under pressure. When you do find yourself faced with unexpected questions and debate, you'll be ready to draw on these tactics and preparation, and so stay poised while you compose your thoughts and prepare your response. Kate then went into some of the details about to apply the philosophy, for example -

Relax

This is often the opposite of how you are feeling when you're under pressure, but in order for your voice to remain calm and for your brain to "think," you have to be as relaxed as possible.

- Take deep breaths. Take a second and give yourself a positive and affirming message.
- Listen. This is critical to thinking on your feet. Why do you need to listen? To make sure you fully understand the question or request before you reply.

This was short but interesting presentation, and P Chris has promised to use it to try and improve his weekly meeting presentations!

About the speaker

Kate's background includes international marketing manager, public relations consultant, research consultant, language programme designer and official translator. All of which has enabled Kate to relate well to varied needs in different corporate environments.

Kate offers training and coaching in English, Cantonese, Mandarin and French. She majored in English at McGill University and in Translation at the Université de Montréal and Université Sorbonne. She is a certified NLP Practitioner. Kate is now based in Hong Kong, her birthplace, after her stay in the US, Canada, Europe and Singapore.
