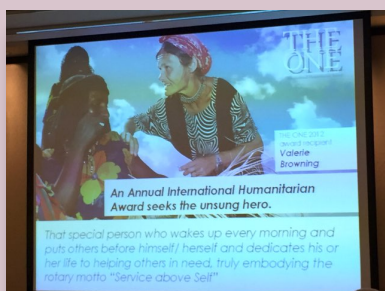
Spotlight On - PDG David Harilela



PDG David was back at our club to give us updates on the two projects closest to his heart, being RGR - Rotary Global Rewards, and The One humanitarian award of which he was the founder during his time as DG.

Rotary Global Rewards

This was chartered by PDG David 2011-12 when it was called the Benefit Card program. It's basically a rewards program to help clubs enhance member satisfaction and retention, by creating an e-shopping mall to offer global discount to 1.2 million Rotarians. RGR gives Rotarians and now Rotaractors access to discounts on a variety of products and services selected with their interest in mind. It is different from the benefit card model in that the money you save goes to the Rotary Foundation. When you give something, you'll receive something in return, so the good you do comes back to you. All Rotarians are eligible as long as you have registered with Rotary.org. It has only just opened up to Rotaractors (PDG David worked to make this happen), and he encouraged us to please share the news with Rotaractors. PDG David described RGR as a win-win-win situation: Rotarians enjoy benefits, vendors gain new business opportunities, and the Rotary Foundation gets the net proceeds. It's easy to redeem rewards. PDG David highlighted that he wants many more offers made available in Hong Kong and to be added to the portfolio of RGR offers to all D3450 Rotarians.



The One

Launched in 2011/12, The One award recognizes the unknown heroes in life who truly put Service Above Self, and dedicate their lives to helping those in need every day. PDG David called them the 'angels' of the world. A wonderful lady called Valerie Browning was the very first winner of The One. She has truly given up everything in order to serve the needy in Ethiopia, and she was awarded US\$100,000 to help further her cause. All three of the other finalists received US\$50,000 each. Since then, many more selfless, devoted individuals have received this much needed injection of hard cash to support the vital work that they do in some of the world's most wretched corners. PDG David also reminded us that the Rotary club that nominates the final winner receives US\$5,000 for any charitable project of its choice, as long as it falls within our 6 areas of focus: Peace, Preventing disease, Water & Sanitation, Maternal and Child Health, Literacy and Community Development. The One is more than just an award, it means we are helping impoverished people in the places where we most need to be doing so. PDG gave the example that, thanks to The One award money, Cynthia Maung has established The One Medical Centre in Cambodia. As an update, PDG David announced that we will launch The One Philippines in 2018.

He ended by illustrating the future vision for The One : Spread The One, and franchise The One all over the world. His message to us was - please continue to support The One by donating and identifying the world's greatest heroes. He also gave special thanks to The One Committee member, our own PP Eddy Wong.

The deadline for nominations for The One Int'l and The One HK is 31st December 2016. And The One Award Gala Dinner will be on May 16, 2017

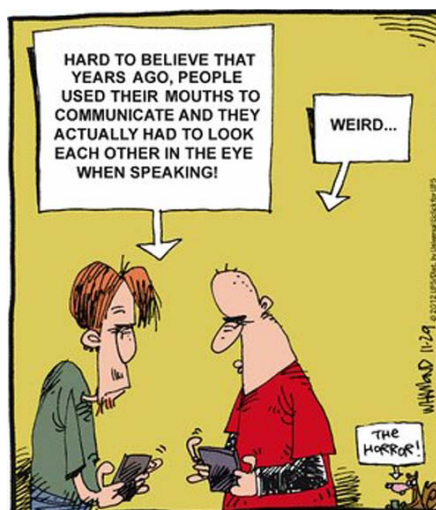
1. The District PP's Dinner will be held on October 14th 2016, Friday at King's Cuisine, Windsor House, Causeway Bay.
