The Universe will always show you the way when you ask. When you are looking at 2017, do you have an idea or a thought of what would you like to create. If you did, you'll ask question about it and see what'll happen, the magic is asking and receiving.

Some people really want to reach in their dreams that seemed so out of their way. A wise saying by Mark Twain "Why not go out on a limb? That's where the fruit is"

There is a reward in daring to go out, daring to stretch yourself to achieve your dreams. Martin Luther King Jr., one of the people who showed us the benefit of asking questions and not bounded by limitation. Every time you are tempted to react in the same old way, ask if you want to be a prisoner of the past or a pioneer of the future.





