
Spotlight On - Creating Code for Change



"Creating Code for Change" is a new project which has just started. In 2007 a project in Beijing which was probably poverty alleviation project helping the migrant children in the city to settle. In this new age of technology those who cannot get into the technology are basically left behind in the technology economy. Social divide and digital divide are what the younger generation are facing. In HK the poverty rate is very high, great need to bridge the gap between the rich and the poor. Why are we trying to teach the kids how to code? Because there are so many resources on the internet, the issue is that most resources on line are accessible only to people who have the education background, the training. Masterpieces on line courses are available to everyone, you can sign up the EDX and take MIT, Harvard courses for free. You have to know the basic. Just like for people climb up the stairs, you need some people to guide, to carry you up, you need some tools and vehicle to bring those people up to a certain platform where you can access the resources. What he believes is the internet should not only

be for rich people, middleclass but for everyone. Education is the great equalizer, allows everybody to have access to it, so is coding. On top of literacy and numeracy, digital literacy will be the third language in the future. Dividing the project into 3 segments and hope every student to have access to the first segment where they will learn the basic concept, those who are more motivated can write simple apps. Not just learning of skill, is also a life changing experience for them. What he hopes the project can do is to get them to learn some skills and at the same time be more motivated to increase their power of confidence. He hopes to build a community with young mentors from the Universities, community mentors from a group of volunteers who are also professionals, care about the younger generation, can provide social capital for them. Mentors are supposed to support, to guide, encourage, provide resources for the disadvantage students. In scaling up he hopes this will start in HK and then in Shenzhen, deployed in India, Cambodia and Africa. Jockey Club has given 230 million to Universities in HK and also MIT, spending a lot of money to teach the younger kids, the primary school kids coding. Teaching about 16,000 students on how to code, spending around 13,000 per student. We are actually collaborating with MIT, reason is that our project is very similar to the project they're doing, helping primary students, high school students. The difference is we are helping disadvantage kids they're helping the more capable students. We're spending 8% of what they spend per student for 3 years. The more students we help, the more cost effective.

Now we have a lot of young people in HK who have no resources but we have lots of mentors, he believes these young people would be able to learn and to explore if they have a group of concerned community mentors who are resourceful to bring them up. Lot of research, sociologist, educators have done research and see the future is not just auto pilot car, many home domestic appliances will need programming, so learning the language to interface with the machine will be a very important skill. Nowadays everyone knows who to email, to use Microsoft word, excel, powerpoint, that's basic. 20 years ago, only people who involved in technology would know how to use that. In the future, coding would be the key.
