Spotlight On - The Way - Camino De Santiago



There are 3 great pilgrimages for Christians in the world: to Rome, Jerusalem, and Santiago de Compostela in Spain. President Jack To Jack embarked on this personal journey in in 2014, as one of his resolutions for the beginning of the year. Camino de Santiago also known by the English name Way of St. Jame. (St. James was one of the 12 apostles until 44 AD. He was beheaded in 44 AD and his body was shipped to Iberia to be buried in Santiago, the boat sank and his body was lost to the ocean.) He started his route from St. Jean-Pied-du-Port in France, flew to Biarritz, and finally took a bus to Finisterre. Some people start from Valencia, Paris and Switzerland. (And some crazy people start from places like Ireland or Berlin). There are three ways of doing the Way – by foot, by horse, by cycle.

Jack explained that when you start you get a stamp book...your pilgrim passport. Every time you stay at a place you get a stamp, and these are accumulated to eventually be showed to the Pilgrim's office in Santiago as proof that the journey was accomplished according to the official route. A certificate of appreciation is given to pilgrims on completing the Way. To earn the certificate one needs to walk a minimum of 100 km or cycle at least 200 km. Pilgrims also carry a shell which marks the routes to Santiago. The grooves in the shell which meet at a single point represent the various routes pilgrims travelled eventually arriving the tomb of St. James. Jack did the walk by himself, and followed a book written by John Bierley. Every day he walked for 8 hours, travelled 20 – 30 km a day. He said that pure walking makes you very reflective, and being disconnected from modern devices is immensely liberating. Some rituals have taken place on with mythical, metaphorical meanings, like carrying a pebble and saying a prayer. Or putting down a pebble on the ground in the hope your friend or

family who have any illness will get better or if you walk through a little back door in a small church based on the Cathedral of Santiago, where all your sins will be washed away. The journey took Jack 28 days and he walked 800 km wearing a backpack that weighed 11 kilos. He averaged 30 – 34 km a day and on bad days only 25 km. You have to keep your eyes on the weather and prepare dry and wet jackets. Today every year there are more than 250,000 Camino de Santiago pilgrims. Jack is planning to do it again in May this year. He said some people do it for repent, for challenge, or for adventure. After his experienced he said he felt changed. He found it hard not to feel spiritually moved walking through the woods, and after his presentation, we all did! Thankyou P Jack!
