# Spotlight On - Hong Kong Rugby



#### **Diana's story**

Diana Li began by telling us that, growing up in HK, like any other girls, she was not supposed to go outdoors to play sports and get her skin too dark, she should be sitting in a room playing piano instead. She still remembers the first time she got a cut above her eye, resulting in stitches, she needed to change her hairstyle to avoid her mom from giving her shouting! She has played for a couple of teams in HK – HKCC and HK Football Club at the same time. The first time she played Rugby when she was asked by a coach at HKCC to support the team and made up the number, second time she played Rugby was a proper league game against Valley Women, one of the strongest team in HK. That's how she started her Rugby career. These days, through a lot of promotion and the Rugby Sevens, rugby is more popular.

Diana told us hat through Rugby she learned to be tough, positive and confidence. It is also about friendship and networking, and she has met a lot of incredible friends, who all help each other out no matter in life or in business.

It's also given her the chance to see the world through Rugby tours to places like India, Korea & Thailand. During her thirteen years' playing Rugby, she gained some achievements. She especially loves the team spirit which really gives her something different, she is giving back to the community. Today she coaches young kids, playing the role of mentor to them at the same time.

Besides coaching she is also community member for Women Rugby Seven in HK. 15 different countries people coming to HK to play. Finally she said rugby has given her chance to meet great people like Deacon Manu.



#### Deacon's story

An accomplished player at international level, Deacon talked about how he uses his professional experience to nurture young children to learn and to understand the values of rugby - Team Work, Respect, Patience, Confidence, Health and Social interaction. With Diana, he has founded and new community and rugby school for less privileged children in HK to learn to play and benefit from rugby. Rugby Academy Asia is an ambitious project which aims to give more children in Asia access to rugby, increasing the number of coaches to 30,000 in the next 4 years. Supported by HSBC and the HK Rugby Union, they target for 50,000 primary students who have never experienced or even heard of the sport, to be inspired

by the game. RAA objectives are to increase participation and skills across Asia, create career pathways and opportunities to study overseas and abroad. Also using Rugby as a vehicle to teach English through Rugby. Deacon finished by giving us an insightful explanation about the 'Haka', a traditional Maroi dance performed by New Zealand national teams, most famously the All Blacks prior to international matches. It serves as a challenge intimidation to the opposing team. Although we were entertained more than intimidated!


