Spotlight On - PP Hubert in Afghanistan



PP Hubert began by giving us some details about Afghanistan: A small country with a population of 33 million. They have experienced more than 40 years of conflict involving such diverse neighbours as Mongolia, by Russia, by Taliban and now they have their own government. Female literacy average only 17%, most of the females they cannot read. In this Islamic country, female is not well respected. Malnutrition is very common. A project incorporated with UN to give more nutrition to the children. Girls get marry before age of 19, the reason is the parents don't want to spend money to raise the girls, in exchange of some cattle. Even the boys also early marriage. 2.3 million children are still off the school. Most children have to work on the street to earn more money, they don't go to school at all. Local displacement because more conflict with Taliban, in 2016 over 500,000 flee conflicts to some other area, one area is Herat. Herat comparatively speaking is a very safe place. Kabul is high risk area. Key challenges in

Afghanistan – Child protection: children has to be forced to work for their families, Education: almost no education can be received due to poor, early marriage due to poor. Displacement: local refugees flee to some other province. Child well being has been exploited. What can we do for child protection issue. HK World Vision use US\$1/2 million established 1) Street children centre- pick up children from the street and provide psychosocial support counseling service, talk to the parents and convince them to let the children come to the centre after work instead of working all day on the street. 2) provide tutorial class most of the children are over 8 compare with other normal children, help them catch up English and Mathematical standard before they can go to normal primary school. 3) Health, employ doctors to provide free medical treatment for children within the community and clinic inside the children centre. Also library and recreational facilities for children. Health and nutrition class for Mother. Displacement actually local refugees, they flee to other provinces because of conflict with Taliban. Informal settlement for Internal displaced person. There is NO electricity, NO water. Established Health Mobile Team to the displacement areas, 12 displacement areas in Herat. Employ 2 doctors take turn to visit every centre to take care of the children. Demonstration to teach the mothers to prepare nutritious food. Mothers themselves form a Mother Health Group. Youth Club - the children they don't have school to go, just form a group to organize some activities, local volunteer teacher comes every day to teach the children simple Mathematics, English and local language. Those children facing changes in their life, they still have smiles on their faces. Let's pray for them. Through World Vision work bring opportunities, smile, love and hope to the most vulnerable especially children in Afghanistan. If there is NO peace, nothing is possible.
