

Meeting called to order at 1:00pm



PP Stacy gave a detailed report on Community service during the first half of the Rotary Year, with plenty of photos. The Presidents-elect Training Seminar

The Bylaws of Rotary International (RI) require that the governor-elect (DGE) of each district, in cooperation with the current governor, schedule and conduct a training seminar for club presidents-elect of the district soon after the DGE returns from the International Assembly.



This Presidents-elect Training Seminar, commonly referred to by its acronym, PETS, is a motivational and leadership training session designed to prepare future club presidents for the office they will assume on 1 July.

Among the subjects covered are: implementation of the RI theme for the coming year as well as the new and continuing programs of RI. Time is also devoted to a review of district operations, planning club and district programs, and organizing Rotary activities for the year ahead. How to prepare a budget, goal-setting, time management and new ideas for club meetings are just some of the useful skills that club presidents-elect have to learn when they attend their district PETS.

Attendance at the PETS is compulsory for all club presidents-elect.
