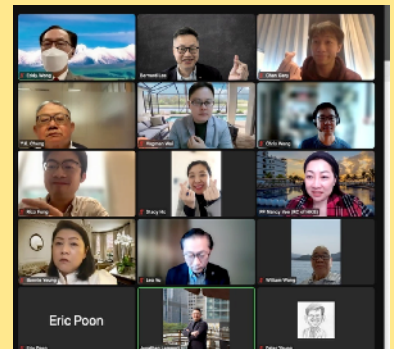

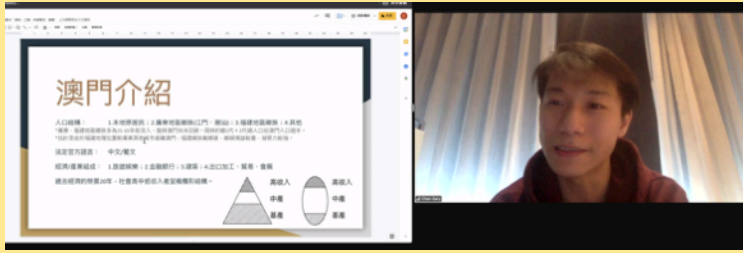
Gary presentation was made in a friendly and light hearted manner, sharing a number of things from Macau itself, its young people, the way they live

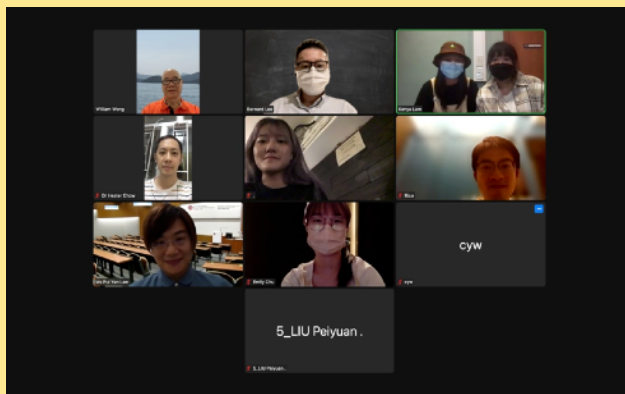


The 'adopt-a-school programme' had paused during the pandemic, and we have all agreed that resuming physical activities may not be the best thing to do.
