## Rotaract and Interact Board Meetings



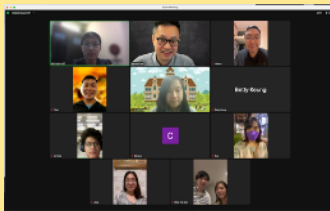
Interact Club of HCSS Board Meeting
