President Rico declared the meeting open and we all stood for Rotary song. After club announcements, Christian Li was invited on stage for sharing.



Dr. Kevin Lau was the speaker of the day. He shared data and opportunities from the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) and the Greater Bay Area.

Research indicates that the Greater Bay Area has high development potential growth rate than that of other major economic zones. Recent policies allow selected hospitals in Mainland China to prescribe treatments previously only available in hospitals in Hong Kong. Where the opposite is receiving less attention, Dr. Lau believes that certain

procedures and practice especially in the medical research field will make its positive impact to Hong Kong.

Medical coverage rate in Hong Kong is still relatively low, and that in Mainland China is even lower. China's medical industry market size will be hitting 10 Billion USD in 2023, with 11% compound annual growth rate. Digital health services in particular is expected to prosper and provide ample business opportunities.

PP Leo Yu gave the vote of thanks.

Rotary Information - Installation Ceremony

While there is no prescribed ceremony for installing officers, some formality is usually observed to honor the new officers and to acknowledge the officers they succeed. A typical order for an installation ceremony can be as follows:

- Presiding: outgoing president or a past president
- Farewell comments from outgoing president
- · Outgoing officers and directors thanked
- · Continuing directors and officers acknowledged
- · New president installed
- Presentation of past president pin to outgoing president
- Installation of incoming officers and directors
- · Introduction of committee chairmen
- · New president's address

Before the ceremony, the Master of Ceremony calls the dignitaries in the dais - President, Spouse of President, Chief Guest (District Official of highest in protocol present in the meeting), and Immediate Past President.

The new president is presented with the president's collar, club charter, gavel and gong by District Official of highest in protocol present in the meeting or, Charter President of the club, or Jointly by all past presidents of the club present in the meeting, or, Immediate Past President.

Oath of incoming President can be administered by District Governor or his representative, Past Governor or Assistant Governor, or any district official present at the meeting or charter president of the club or any past president of the club.

Upcoming Events




President Rico's Board of Directors had been working diligently to plan for this Rotary Year.
