The programme was consisted of reports by PDG Eric Chin, District Membership Chair, and sharing by

Rotarians with insights and good practices to grow and retain Memberships. Corporate membership, Rotaractors, and

satellite clubs, etc. were cited as growth possibilities. Orientation and regular 'fire side' after joining are equally important to continuously engage new members. Clubs with membership consistently below 20 would also require careful mentoring.





Despite COVID-19 which resulted in worldwide decline in membership, our District achieved a net growth of one Rotarian per Club for 2021-22 which is 'well done'. PDG Y.K. also drew attention to RI President Jennifer Jones' remarks on

Membership, notably the points on "know your members and make good use of exit interviews". We were all impressed by the organizing work, and inspired by the interesting ideas



presented. All of these facilitated us to better imagine Membership!

Rotary Information - Excerpts from RI President Jennifer Jones on Membership

There is so much that each of us can do to help create club experiences that are welcoming, inclusive and enjoyable for each and every member. And just as importantly, how we are able to extend the same warmth and belonging to every participant who wishes to engage with our clubs.

Over and over, our surveys find that the comfort and care of our members is the single greatest driver of member



satisfaction and it is our most powerful tool to keeping our members engaged in our clubs. This comfort and care philosophy begins with listening. We need to understand why our members took the leap and joined us and we need to know what they expect from us. And how do they aspire to change and influence our communities and our world, through their membership?

To build stronger clubs, we should aim to understand the needs and expectations of new members right from the start. And we need to keep taking their temperature regularly to see if those expectations are being met or what we can do to help them get more out of their Rotary experience. These touch points will reassure members that they are being heard, and that we care about their comfort and satisfaction.

We know our members find their way into Rotary through many diverse paths. We also know the outcome if they are not taken care of, they leave Rotary. Traditionally, many club conduct exit interviews to see why a member has decided to leave, and this is a valuable tool. That said, if we are only checking in after a member has chosen to leave, we are too late. Let us check in annually with our members by conducting and acting on the results of member satisfaction surveys. And let us incorporate entrance interviews into our process. Asking what they want from their membership and then helping them to achieve their dreams.

Valuable resources within rotary are designed to help you enrich your experience as people of purpose, people of influence, people of action. A big part of this work is honouring Rotary's
