The Rotary Club of Hong Kong Island East held its inauguration meeting at 1:00p.m. on 11 March, 1954 at Winner House, North Point, Hong Kong.

On 6 April, 1954, together with the Rotary Club of Hong Kong Island West, the Club formally received its charter from Rotary International.

A joint Charter Night was held at the Ritz Nightclub on 28 May, 1954 when Past RI Administrative Advisor, Charlie T.F. Wei, officially presented the charters to the two new Clubs.

The officers elected from the 25 charter members were John Yuen (Founder President), K.C. Goh (Vice-President), Patrick Cha (Hon. Secretary), Dragon Nie (Hon. Treasurer), and 6 Rotarians as Directors.

The territorial limits of the Club include those parts of Hong Kong Island to the east of Arsenal Street all the way to Chai Wan. Our mother Club is the Rotary Club of Hong Kong.

Anniversary are wonderful because it brings the Club members together. The main purpose is to honor the past, celebrate the present, and gather confidence for the future.

Counting the years, we will be 70 years old on 6 April 2024. As the Chinese saying goes, "人 生七十古來稀"。

Last November, I convened a working group to kick off the Anniversary planning work. We are Island East, and we deserve a celebration that has class, worthy of being remembered for the right reason, and does justice to our reputation.

The views exchanged reinforced the thoughts of doing anniversary projects with greater public image impact, that benefit the Island East geographical area, and bond our daughter clubs and sister clubs.

Ideas explored include roving exhibition of photo and painting competition at MTR Stations in the Island East area, and joint projects with our 7 sister clubs preferably involving Foundation grants. I will keep you posted regularly.

COVID has delayed matters: an organizing committee will be set up soon comprising recent and past Club leaders, and new members, with relevant expertise/skillsets. Planning work will involve sourcing materials like photos and documents, updating our website, "imagining", and storming our brains.

Extra hands are always welcome. We may be competing with our other Rotary commitments for talents! Doing well on our anniversary will give us even greater confidence to prepare for our 75th anniversary.

The District Public Image Seminar was held on 9 September, 2022. It was chaired by District Public Image Coordinator PDG Bear (Lam). President Rico Fung, PP Eddy Wong and Rtn Eric Poon attended the event.

According to PDG Bear, the seminar would help Rotary Clubs achieve the 'Future Goals of Rotary Public Image', in terms of building Rotary into a strong brand and telling a comprehensive Rotary Story. This means when people see the Rotary Wheel, they immediately recognize Rotary; and people will know that Rotary is a leader in combining the different cultures and professions of the world, as demonstrated by the 'Diversity, Equality and Inclusion'(DEI) initiative.

The 2 key speakers, PE Bernie Wong from RC of Causeway Bay, and Rotarian Sam Sio from RC of Metropolitan HK, shared how their companies have helped international businesses, non-profit organizations, individuals, and government bodies promote brands, products and services.

It was a good training session for the Telling the PoA(People of Action) stories competition.

The event ended with a workshop that helped Rotarians to put learning into practices.

Key takeaways on preparing Public Image photos and videos:

- Know our Audience
- Aware of the Pain-points and Offer Solutions.
- Call for Actions, whether that be 'like', 'Read', 'Comment', 'Question', 'Share', etc.
- Content-flow Management, with Introduction, Main ideas, and Conclusions
- Define KPIs (Key performance indicators).
- Impact of Social Media platforms



• Attention span of most people on mobile phones platforms, which is 8 seconds only. Therefore, the key messages should be delivered powerfully at the beginning.

mooncakes, masks and RAT test kits to the residents in subdivided flats for their use and enjoyment. Hopefully, this assistance will temporarily relieve their difficulties and give them encouragement in the run up to the Mid Autumn festival.

Special thanks to PP Laurence Chan for donating HK\$10,000 Supermarket coupons for the service project.
