#### District Youth Protection Webinar, 11 November, 2022



PP Leo Yu and IPP Bernard Lee were contributors of this year's District Youth Protection Webinar on 11 November, 2022. The webinar received great response, with over 100 Rotarians and Rotaractors attended the meeting virtually.

PP Leo is also DS Club Affairs and District Youth Protection Officer this year. He introduced our District Youth Protection Policy, its team, advisors, and explained Rotary's standpoint and recommendations for



clubs for incident prevention and crisis handling. Online resources and documents were shared.

IPP Bernard shared the topic of Cyber Bullying, which is a topic of increasing concern as youths are using social and online tools in their everyday life more than ever.

PP Silva Yeung shared his experience on what to do and not to do should we need to handle complaints and sexual abuse cases, where the case handling itself is delicate in nature.

## Rotary Carbon Reduction and Ecology Summit - 30 October, 2022

The Rotary Carbon Reduction and Ecology Summit was held simultaneously in Hong Kong, Macau and Mongolia, online and offline, on 30 October 2022.

DG Norman shared RI's emphasis on the Protect Planet Earth initiative. He personally used the web site of China Light and Power to measure carbon footprint, and calls for us to do the same with our families.

Mr. Wong Kam-sing, GBS, JP, gave his keynote speech. Mr. Wong is an architect himself. Prior to his role as Secretary for the Environment, he signature project was the CIC-Zero Carbon Park in Kowloon Bay. Hong Kong is moving towards zero carbon footprint by the year 2050. There had been much planning by the Government, leading by example. According to the Paris Agreement, there will be an inspection every 5 years with re-alignment of target, plan and transparency.

Mr. Wong also believes technology is important for our environment  $O \cdot PARK1$  is capable of handling 200 tonnes of food waste per day. Waste processing plants can also turn methane into energy, which otherwise will hurt the atmosphere if released into the air.

Mr. Ron Chung, Director of Business Planning & Regulatory Affairs, CLP Power shared his insider's view on energy generation and consumption. While not having adequate space for traditional decarbonisation initiatives, Hong Kong is being very innovative in achieving the same at the International level. He sees achieving zero carbon footprint by 2050 feasible.

Leung Wing-Mo, Adjunct Professor, The HK Polytechnic University, and Dr. Leo Chan, As-

sociate Director of the State Key Laboratory of Marine Pollution of the City University of Hong Kong shared their professional insights of ocean life, ecosystems and global warming.

Carbon credit certificates are presented to DG Norman and to our guest speakers for their contribution in this summit.
