He was working on the last mile for ending Polio, where in places like Pakistan, it can be risky for volunteers to go there to deliver vaccination. He also started attending Rotary's Zone Institute as a Rotarian. This coming year it would be held in Kaohsiung. IPDG Norman was appointed as Vice Chair for the Kaoshiuang institute, and he will arrange a pre-event trip to get to know the event ahead of time and have some fun together.

Among his club visits, Penang was his favourite. He also attended a District Conference while he was in Arizona, US.

IPDG Norman also shared on how he pushed for Digital Transformation and Virtual Vocational Exhange with the District, as well as other notable and memorable moments while he was DG. He thanked PDG YK for his advice on getting the resolution within the District passed on moving to a limited by guarantee corporation according to RI bylaws, which reasons and implications were not easy to understand and convey.
