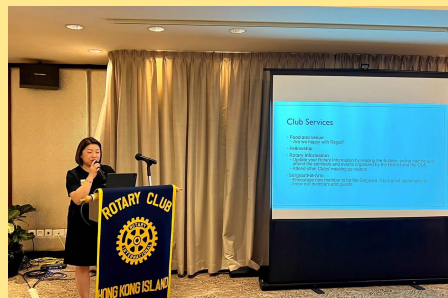

October is Rotary International's Economic & Community Development Month. The key for Community Development is to provide sustainable ongoing development and help, not just immediate charity.

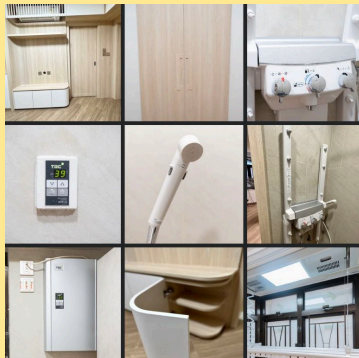
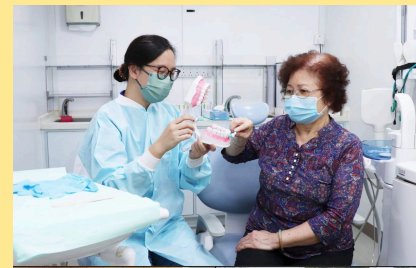
