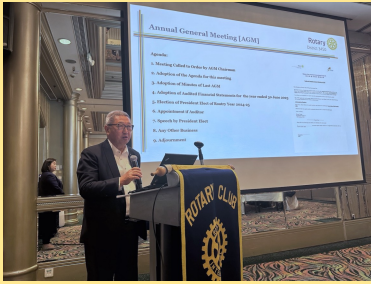
**Visiting Rotarian and Guest:**

The AGM was officially opened by PP Council Chair, PP George Leung.

The meeting was chaired by PDG Y.K. Cheng. A quorum was declared with 22 members in attendance. The agenda for the AGM was proposed for adoption by PP George Leung and seconded by PP Leo Yu.

Honorary Secretary IPP Rico Fung discussed the qualified audit opinion received due to some unidentified payment records, which are currently being resolved. He noted that expenditures had increased during PDG



Norman's year of governorship and the 70th Anniversary year. Additionally, account receivables had decreased. PP David Li mentioned that audits for non-profit organizations have become more stringent, which will impact the club in the coming years.

President Bonnie proposed the adoption of the audited financial statements, which was seconded by PP Eddy Wong.

The PP Council, led by PP George Leung, nominated Rtn Lawrence Lui as the next President. Despite his short tenure with the club, Rtn Lawrence Lui has demonstrated commitment and dedication. The nomination was proposed by PP George Leung and seconded by IPP Rico Fung. The members present unanimously voted in favor, and Rtn Lawrence Lui assumed the role of President Elect immediately.



The motion to re-appoint the current auditor was proposed by PP Tim Lui and seconded by PP Eddy Wong.

PE Lawrence Lui expressed his gratitude for the support and encouragement from the members. He conveyed his confidence in being ready for the leadership role with their continued support.

The AGM was officially closed by PP George Leung.

President Bonnie Yeung proceeded with our regular meeting. We celebrated the birthdays of PP Tim Lui, PP Eddy Wong and Rtn Mofiz Chan.



PP Leo Yu is Intercity Meeting committee chair. President Bonnie called on us to give him support.

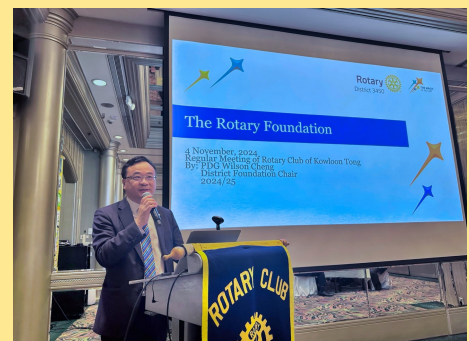

PP Leo Yu introduced our speaker, PDG Wilson Cheng.

PDG Wilson gave an introduction of the Rotary Foundation. With the recent inclusion of Rotaractors, Rotary now has a membership strength of 1.4 million. Rotary is organized into 34 zones and 533 districts, overseen by the Rotary International (RI) President and Directors.

The Rotary Foundation is the primary source of funding for RI. Funds are allocated to zones and districts through Global Grants, District Grants, and other Foundation Programs, all managed with careful stewardship. The mission of The Rotary Foundation is to enable Rotary members to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty worldwide. The Rotary Foundation aims for projects to be sustainable and



aligned with Rotary's seven areas of focus: Peacebuilding and Conflict Prevention; Disease Prevention and Treatment; Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene; Maternal and Child Health; Basic Education and Literacy; Community Economic Development; and Protecting Our Environment.

There are many ways to donate to the Rotary Foundation. One way is Every Rotarian Every Year (EREY), which our Club participates using our membership dues. Additionally, there are Paul Harris Fellow, Paul Harris Society, and other recognized gifts and donations that Rotarians can make voluntarily. Programs like End Polio are also available for annual participation. Rotary encourages our contributions by returning a portion to our District three years later in the form of District Grants.

PDG Wilson then introduced several signature projects supported by the Rotary Foundation, followed by Rotary's "Programs of Scale" initiative, launched in 2020-2021 to encourage long-term, high-impact programs led by our members. Rotary has based its actions on a strong theory of change and has integrated monitoring, evaluation, and collaborative learning systems to ensure continuous improvement.



Rtn Jason Chiu gave the vote of thanks to PDG Wilson.

President Bonnie welcomed President Carson Toh from our sister club, the Rotary Club of Penang. President Carson has maintained strong connections with us. This was already his third trip to Hong Kong this year, and he looks forward to seeing us more often.

Honorary Treasurer IPP Rico Fung announced the red box amount of HK\$2,940.
