The award ceremony for the 3rd RCHKIE Student Smart Phone Photo Competition was held immediately before lunch meeting.

Mr. Jason Fong was the speaker of the day. He is Global Head of Family Office HK. During his sharing, he provided an insightful deep dive into Hong Kong's position as a premier destination for family offices and international investment.

Hong Kong is a unique place for family offices. Unlike Singapore, Hong Kong does not require family offices to register or apply for a license, preserving confidentiality for high-networth individuals.

Hong Kong's Monetary System is also strong and transparent. The Hong Kong Dollar is linked to the US Dollar and backed by 1.7 times the monetary reserves, providing stability and confidence for investors. Among those attracted to Hong Kong are LVMH, Ferrari, Porsche, and leading philanthropists.

Hong Kong's OASIS Initiative (Office for Attracting Strategic Enterprises) targets key industries such as life sciences, AI, fintech, advanced manufacturing, and renewable energy. Major global players, including AstraZeneca, have already established a presence in Hong Kong due to its globally recognized regulatory standards.

The Hong Kong Talent Engage Initiative is actively recruiting high-caliber professionals across multiple sectors, including family office expertise.

Hong Kong is resilient and holds a strategic importance in the global financial landscape. While challenges exist, Hong Kong remains a stable, tax-friendly, and well-connected hub for family offices and investors.

Hong Kong's new Capital Investment Entrant Scheme (CIES) offers tax benefits and residency options for family office investors, further enhancing the city's appeal. Hong Kong remains the only legal and compliant center for digital asset trading within China, leveraging the One Country, Two Systems framework. With three new digital exchange licenses, Hong Kong is poised to be a major gateway for international investors in the digital economy.

Rtn Alexander Fong Ling was born in Shanghai on 3 August 1940 and joined our Club in 1974. His father, William Ling, was President of our Club in 1967-68, and in whose name the William Ling Scholarship was established. Rtn Alex followed his father's footsteps. He studied Architecture at The University of Hong Kong and was a stalwart in Eric Cumine Architects.

The story of Alex will not be complete if tennis is not mentioned. This has been his life long passion and commitment, as an accomplished player winning numerous local competitions and representing Hong Kong in the international arena, and later as an ambassador, coach and staunch promoter of the game. His influence on the development of tennis in Hong Kong has been immense.

Both Alex and RotaryAnne Yuen Yuen are elected Hall of Fame members of the Hong Kong Coaches & Trainers Association. Yuen Yuen herself comes from a distinguished tennis family.
