IPP Rico Fung introduced our speaker, Mr. Andrew Wong. Andrew is a register Psychologist with the Hong Kong Psychological Society, a Chartered Psychologist and an Associate Fellow with the British Psychological Society. He is also a Certified MBTI Practitioner.

During his sharing, he introduced to us the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator, a popular personality assessment tool that categorizes individuals into 16 distinct personality types based on their preferences in four key areas:

Extraversion (E) vs. Introversion (I): This dimension indicates where you get your energy from - either from interacting with others (Extraversion) or from spending time alone (Introversion).

Sensing (S) vs. Intuition (N): This dimension reflects how you prefer to take in information - either through concrete, factual data (Sensing) or by looking at patterns and possibilities (Intuition).

Thinking (T) vs. Feeling (F): This dimension shows how you make decisions - either based on logical analysis (Thinking) or by considering personal values and the impact on others (Feeling).

Judging (J) vs. Perceiving (P): This dimension indicates how you prefer to organize your life - either with a structured, planned approach (Judging) or a more flexible, spontaneous approach (Perceiving).

Andrew interacted with us for a simplified self assessment, then proceeded to explain some of the dynamics, differentiating between ability and personality. For example, those who do not enjoy speaking in reality can be a very good speaker. While personality does not usually change, one can adapt and interact well with their opposites, although usually at the expense

of consuming mental energy using the process. Those whose personality type matches the environment on the other hand will have their mental energy replenished during the process of interaction.

Understanding one's self personality can help us empathise our family, friends and colleagues and work partners for better relationships, and help us deal with stress in a positive manner.
