AG Mark Tong, Hong Kong Harbour



President Bonnie Yeung welcomed Assistant Governor Mark Tong and presented her year-end report.

Rotary International's President-Elect for the 2025–26 term, Mário César Martins de Camargo, has resigned from his position. Francesco Arezzo of Italy has been selected as the new President-Elect. At the conclusion of her term, President Bonnie will assume the role of Membership Director.

Sixty percent of this year's membership growth in our District came from existing clubs. However, some clubs—including our own—faced challenges due to local conditions. Our Club experienced a net loss of six members, representing a 12% decline in membership. While Rotary has seen membership declines in Europe and the U.S., Rotary International is now focusing on Asia for new member recruitment. In her new role, President Bonnie plans to strengthen fellowship within the Club.

As of today, we have achieved our targeted contribution to The Rotary Foundation. Thirty-five of our members have received Paul Harris Fellow recognition at various levels. Additionally, we are proud to have eight benefactors and six major donors.

In the area of community service, our student photo competition remains our flagship project. Winning entries were displayed in MTR stations, significantly enhancing our public image. Special thanks go to Past President Rudy Law for leading the event, and to Rotarian Jason Chiu for arranging media coverage.

A two-day workshop was held as part of a joint Area 3 service project focused on mental health. HR professionals and SME owners were invited to share insights on mental wellness and workplace well-being. The event drew over 200 attendees.



We also proudly sponsored the “Everyone is Beautiful” service project hosted by the Rotary Club of Hong Kong Harbour, which promotes inclusion for people with disabilities.

Our Junioract Club at CCC Kei Wan Primary School (Aldrich Bay) actively participated in several initiatives, including Pamela Youde Hospital Day and our “Magic of Tennis” service project, which brought together children from Ultimate United. Additionally, our members supported the Christmas party for children and families at Ultimate United.

We enjoyed strong fellowship with our sister clubs in Kawasaki South, Niigata, and Osaka Jonan. Rotarian Christian Li organized two well-received fellowship events, further strengthening our bonds. Our Club leaders also took part in key District events throughout the year.

President Bonnie concluded her report by sharing a message from all Club Presidents to District Governor Nigel Lo:

As we come to the close of this Rotary term, we want to extend our heartfelt gratitude for a truly remarkable year under your leadership. Reflecting on the journey, we are proud of the incredible achievements and the meaningful impact we’ve made in our communities—thanks to your vision and guidance.

Your unwavering dedication to Rotary’s mission has inspired us to embrace service with renewed passion. You have fostered a spirit of collaboration and camaraderie that has strengthened our bonds and empowered us to make a real difference.
