August marks the birthday of **Rtn Alex Ling**, who has been a dedicated member of our club for 51 years. President Lawrence Lui led us in celebrating this milestone with warm birthday wishes.



Last week, President Lawrence and PDG Norman attended the **Rotary Club of Penang's** 95th anniversary and installation night, and we renewed our 53-year sisterhood relationship with a ceremonial signing.

PP Mark Wang shared that the **Rotary Club of Singapore**, like Penang, is celebrating its 95th anniversary this year.

As Singapore's oldest club, it belongs to RI District 3310, which includes Brunei, Singapore, and parts of Malaysia such as Johore, Malacca, Sarawak, Labuan, and Sabah.



With 175 members, the club has completed over 300 global grant service projects - two-thirds initiated by Singapore.

During the Japanese occupation of Singapore in 1942, the Rotary Club of Singapore was forced to suspend its activities as many of its members were interned in harsh conditions at Changi and Sime Road camps. Following the liberation of Singapore in 1945, the club was revived.



Dinner meetings are held every Wednesday, except the second Wednesday of each month, which is a lunch meeting. Service meetings take place every Thursday. PP Mark warmly invited us to visit their club.

President Lawrence exchanged club flags with Rtn Hassan Moosa, Vice President of Public Relations for the Rotary Club of Singapore.

PP Bernard Lee introduced our guest speaker, Mr. Keith Cheuk.

**Mr. Cheuk** attended his first Rotary meeting in 1998. He studied in a government school (King's College) in Hong Kong before going to the U.K. He was surprised by how little many people there knew about Hong Kong.

He recently joined Fun-Tastic, a young nonprofit organization dedicated to bridging generations through technology. Over its 18-month journey, members have devoted time and heart to helping youth connect with the elderly - organizing memories, facilitating communication, and fostering meaningful relationships.



While mobile devices dominate young lives, adults often lack technical skills and rarely interact with younger generations. Fun-Tastic empowers youth to serve and engage the elderly, who in turn share wisdom, history, and culture - lessons no textbook can teach. Mr. Cheuk's HR background supports the NGO's volunteer recruitment and coordination.

In his day job, Mr. Cheuk leads fundraising for the Youth Literature Foundation, which for 16 years has encouraged children aged 5–17 to express emotions through writing. Annual competitions are held via schools to keep education involved, with special attention to ethnic minorities and students with special needs. Artistic submissions are also welcomed.

He also manages Mandarin classes for non-Chinese speakers at Mandarin Matrix, where cultural understanding often precedes language learning. The program supports countries engaged in business and cultural exchange with China, especially those in the Belt and Road initiative.

Grateful to continue his family's three-generation legacy in education - rooted in Mainland China and Thailand - Mr. Cheuk believes youth must harness technology wisely, and he's committed to helping them do just that.
