AG Wilson Shum, Hong Kong Northeast

We celebrated the birthdays of PDG Norman Lee, PPs Andrew Chen & Nancy Yee.

The District Grant application for our Student Smartphone Photo Contest service project had been submitted.



Our second **dinner gathering** of this Rotary year will take place on **17 September 2025** at the **Hopewell Inn**. PP Leo Yu has invited **PP Dr. John Wong** to speak on assessing and preventing coronary heart disease. This event also celebrates this month's Rotary theme - **Basic Education and Literacy** - by promoting literacy in health and well-being.

As 1 October 2025 is a holiday, our next meeting will be the **DG Visit** on **15 October 2025**. Please mark your calendars and show your support for our Club.

AG Wilson Shum expressed his enthusiasm in sharing the District messages. He began by inviting members to reflect on the significance of the number "3" in Rotary, which symbolizes our area, our District, our rolling action (succession) plan, and the elements of this year's theme - "body, mind, and soul" - as introduced by **DG Cassy Cheng**.

RI President Francesco Arezzo also emphasized three key priorities: membership development, polio eradication, and peace - with membership placed at the forefront. He highlighted that Rotary's greatest asset is its people, and that membership development involves engaging with individuals while upholding Rotary's standards.

AG Wilson then introduced DG Cassy's background, noting her belief in mental leadership and her strong focus on well-being, exemplified through initiatives such as sports events and comedy show featuring Rotary leaders. He emphasized that it is through our soul that we inspire and attract others to join Rotary's mission. Vocational service, he noted, is a powerful expression of our soul, as it reflects the spirit we share as Rotarians. He also commended President Lawrence for advancing the Joint Rotaract Installation and Vocational Talk.

President Lawrence thanked AG Wilson for sharing the District's message to guide our direction, and then proceeded with the Club Assembly.



IPP Bonnie credited her achievements to the Club and its teamwork. She reported on upcoming membership development initiatives and shared case studies on how other Districts approach growth. She emphasized the importance of engaging within our own vocations, embracing diversity and flexibility, and understanding our strengths to identify the right potential members.



PP Nancy shared her perspective on her role and responsibilities as Honorary Secretary, supporting the President and managing all internal and external correspondence. She also presented member data, fun facts, and statistics—complete with charts—to foster a stronger sense of belonging within the Club.



Rtn Christian Li is engaging various partners in service projects aligned with our District theme of body, mind, and soul. The **HKCRA Go Chess project** and the **Student**





Smartphone Photo Competition promote mental development. The Magic of Tennis project encourages youth to nurture their physical well-being. The “Under the Same Sky” initiative invites soul-searching through the exchange of ideas on education and how we can make the world a better place. Upcoming partner service projects include support for single young mothers, as well as mooncake distribution and free massages for the elderly.

In youth service, we are collaborating with all our Rotaract clubs on the Joint Rotaract Installation and Vocational Service event. We also plan to reach out to Lingnan University regarding the possible reinstatement of their Rotaract club.

PP William is actively promoting our Student Smartphone Photo Competition to sister clubs and encouraged members to attend the upcoming RI Convention in Taipei.

Rtn Jason Chiu shared his plans to diversify meeting and fellowship formats, reconnect with former members, and boost engagement with new ones—such as by resuming golf events and organizing trips to mainland China. PP Eddy Wong reported on our progress toward club foundation targets, while PP Leo Yu provided updates on the upcoming Joint Rotaract Installation and Vocational event.

Club Activities




