The meeting with District Governor Cassy Cheng and District officers began at 5:30pm at the Hopewell Inn. AG Wilson Shum introduced DG Cassy and her team. President Lawrence Lui introduced our Board members.



DG Cassy Cheng addressed our Board with this year's District directives. President Lawrence provided an overview of our club, then invited board members to present their plans for the year.

One of this year's **highlights** is the focus on membership and fellowship, which go hand in hand. To strengthen member engagement, some meetings will be shifted to evenings, and group leaders will host fellowship dinners to foster stronger bonds and encourage greater attendance. DG Cassy encouraged us to re-establish sustainable, signature projects, foster meaningful connections with our service partners, guide our Rotaract clubs to set their goals, and in the process we can also strengthen our membership ties.

Our Club meeting followed.

We will be partnering with the **Rotary Clubs of Happy Valley and Hong Kong Northeast** for a joint service project supporting elderly households and the homeless. In addition, our club has committed to supporting the **Cambodia Children Advocacy Association** by funding the purchase of a tuk-tuk, which will transport over 100 local children to and from school daily. A club visit to Cambodia is also planned for November to strengthen our connection with the community and witness the impact firsthand.

Following the **Joint Rotaract Installation and Vocational Talk**, PP Leo Yu will host a second vocational session in March.

New member name badges are now available. All members are reminded to keep their badges and bring them to club meetings.

President Lawrence invited DG Cassy Cheng to address our Club. She started with sharing her journey, selling her business to pursue service. She held board roles at secondary schools. Since joining Rotary in 2011, she served as club president for two consecutive years.



DG Cassy believes we are **servant leaders** - listening to members, fostering collaboration and empathy, and building a community of belonging. She noted RI President Francesco Arezzo's appointment and his focus on membership, polio eradication, and peace.

Rotary's most valuable assets are its history and its members. Membership growth is supported by three key pillars: **innovation, leadership continuity, and diverse partnerships**. To meet evolving needs, we must think creatively, communicate responsively, and encourage active participation. Building strong relationships with partner NGOs is also essential for sustaining long-term project impact.

Passionate members inspire others. AG Wilson will become a Major Donor. DG Cassy hopes each club contributes two Paul Harris Fellowship. The Rotary Foundation supports District and Global Grants, including this year's project to build water stations in Inner Mongolia, saving daily long walk of 3 to 5km - especially in winter when temperatures reach -30°C.

DG Cassy encouraged us to keep social media updated to showcase our work, and submit write-ups for the District newsletter. She also urged members to stay in Hong Kong and support local businesses. President Lawrence will join the District Dragon Boat Competition, and she hopes more members will join too.

On peace, she noted that we enjoy freedom in Hong Kong not because the world is peaceful, but because we're fortunate to live in a peaceful society. Through our service projects, we should promote peace and share Rotary's core values with our communities and beyond.

IPP Bonnie Yeung administered the **induction of Mr. Tommy Yeung**. President Lawrence is his proposer. DG Cassy pinned Rtn Tommy, and President Lawrence presented his membership package. We warmly welcomed Tommy into the Rotary family.



Rtn Tommy expressed his joy and enthusiasm in joining the club and looks forward to contributing to our activities and initiatives.

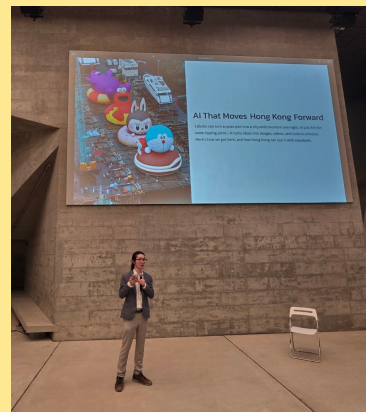
