Warmest Congratulations to PP Jonathan Lamport on His Election to the Legislative Council



PP Jonathan proposed a **five-point platform** to strengthen Hong Kong: accelerate business transformation and smart-city development, deepen Greater Bay Area collaboration (including the Northern Metropolis and a Hong Kong–Shenzhen innovation circle), reinforce **Hong Kong’s financial-center edge** through improved financing support, fintech, family offices, and green finance, and expand global trade networks via Belt and Road opportunities and a “super-connector” role.

He also emphasized **cross-industry innovation** and **talent building** through stronger industry–academia–research collaboration, support for youth entrepreneurship, and a push for **low-carbon and carbon-neutral development**—drawing on experience in solar/BIPV and smart energy management to advance a greener economy and a zero-carbon building ecosystem.

We have received over 800 entries from 66 secondary schools and 22 primary schools, with 3 special schools also participating—making this a truly vibrant and inclusive celebration of student creativity.



Area 3 recently supported a **transitional housing site** for families affected by the Tai Po fire. We helped refurbish 10 housing units, allowing the NGO to move 10 families into Ho Yuet House on 10 December 2025. The centre expects to receive another group of families in January 2026.



The **Social Welfare Sector Triathlon E-Sports Competition** was held on 22 November 2025 at Discovery Park, in conjunction with the Golden Age Foundation and Medmind Technology, focusing on **active ageing, community health, digital inclusion, and intergenerational participation**.



President Lawrence and the Rotaractors from PolyU CPCE attended the **Children’s Heart Foundation (CHF) “Heart to Heart Charity Walk 2025”** at The Peak Galleria on 23 November 2025, showing support for CHF’s annual fundraising and awareness campaign on congenital heart disease.
